Objectives:

- To create a preliminary list of research EPAs to be used for subsequent phases of the proposed study.

Description: Colleges and schools of pharmacy are advocating for the development of research skills in student pharmacists. However, standardized recommendations for achieving research competency across pharmacist training programs are still lacking. PharmAlliance faculty members are partnering to develop research Entrustable Professional Activity (EPA) statements for the training of student pharmacists. Specifically, this project will address the research questions: What research activities should pharmacy students be entrusted to perform upon graduation? During the PharmAlliance meeting, a focus group will be held with invited attendees to generate draft research EPAs. Focus group participants will receive a list of research EPAs drafted by the study investigators prior to the focus group.

Then we will focus on the emerging project, looking at the Core Concepts of Medicinal Chemistry project which emerged during discussions in 2022. Finally, we will discuss potential future core concept disciplines and initiatives.

Objectives:

- Identify the core elements that contribute to resilience and well-being
- Explore existing teaching activities where resilience and well-being are taught, practised or assessed
- Consider how resilience and well-being focussed meaningful activities could be scaffolded within a multi year Pharmacy curriculum

Description: There is a need to prepare a pharmacy workforce that is equipped in basic psychosocial skills, trained to reflect on coping strategies and psychological support mechanisms in line with the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals 3 and 4 which emphasises the importance of good health and well-being for all as well as quality education. In this session, participants will discuss ways in which to best support resilience and well-being in students in preparation for the Pharmacy workforce.

### Teaching of Mental Health Conditions

Sara Garfield from UCL will give an overview of her current projects including developing a safe discharge medicines management intervention for older people who have family carers, vaccine hesitancy and opioid stewardship. She will also briefly touch on some co-design educational projects that she is involved with. Yogini Jani will provide an overview of her current research program including evaluations of digital systems (use, design, functionality and configuration) to improve medication safety and develop learning health systems. Jenni Ilomaki from Monash will discuss the use of real-world data for drug repurposing. Justin Turner will talk about population-level interventions if deprescribing opioids and benzodiazepines. Denise Rhoney will discuss the pivotal role of clinical reasoning in propelling pharmacy practice forward, highlighting considerations in developing clinical reasoning in adult learners and highlighting its potential to enhance patient care and optimising medication therapy. Delesha Carpenter's talk will focus on opportunities to train community pharmacists and student pharmacists to engage in expanded suicide prevention roles, including acting as suicide prevention gatekeepers and implementing means restriction activities.
