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## Session 3: Entrepreneurship and Commercialisation - The Faculty Entrepreneur's Journey



This session examined pathways from academic research to translation and commercialisation across the three regions and PharmAlliance institutions. Faculty entrepreneurs shared their experiences of establishing spin-out companies, including key opportunities, challenges, and lessons learned throughout the commercialisation process. Facilitated discussions then explored opportunities for PharmAlliance to strengthen collective approaches to research translation, entrepreneurship, and commercialisation.
